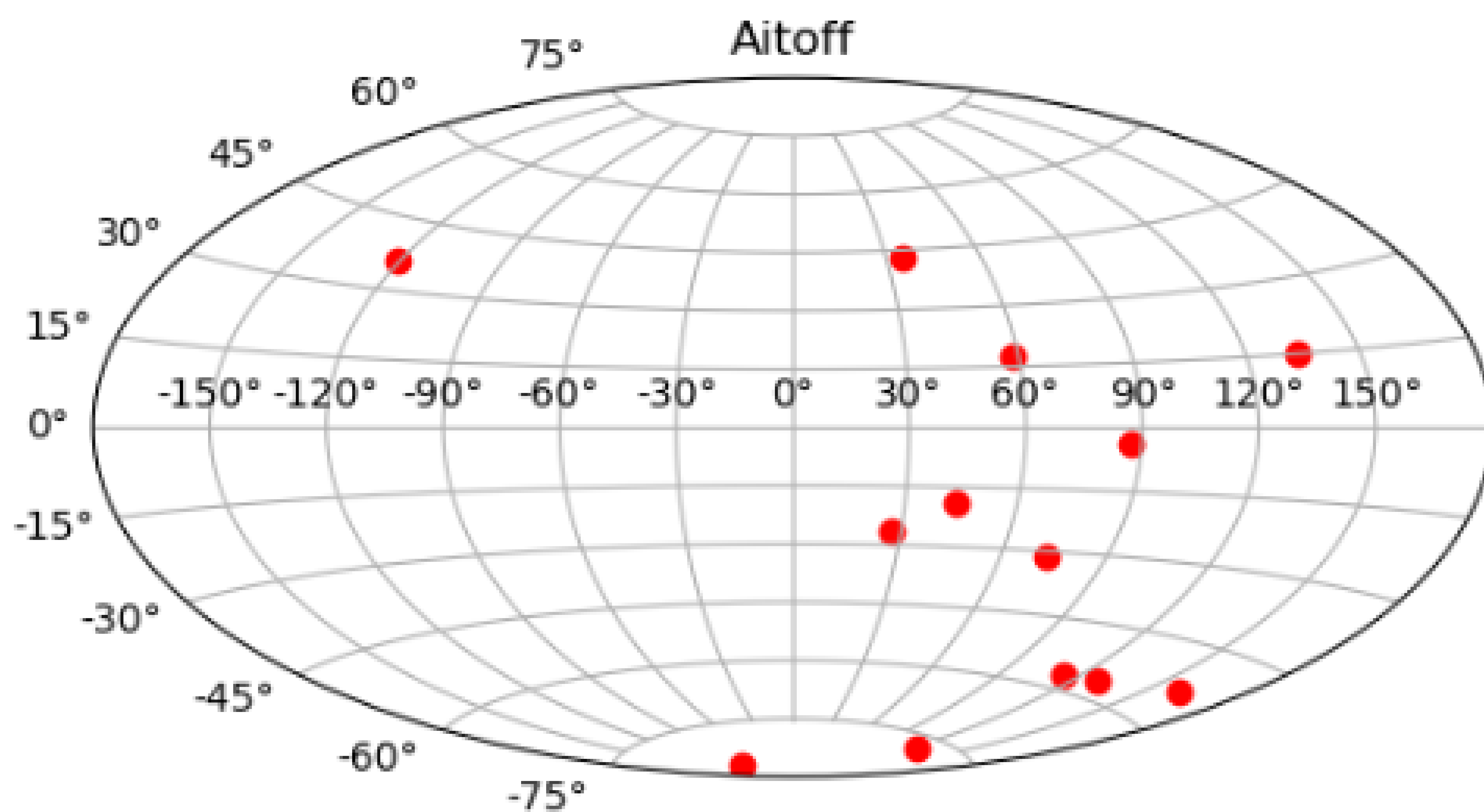
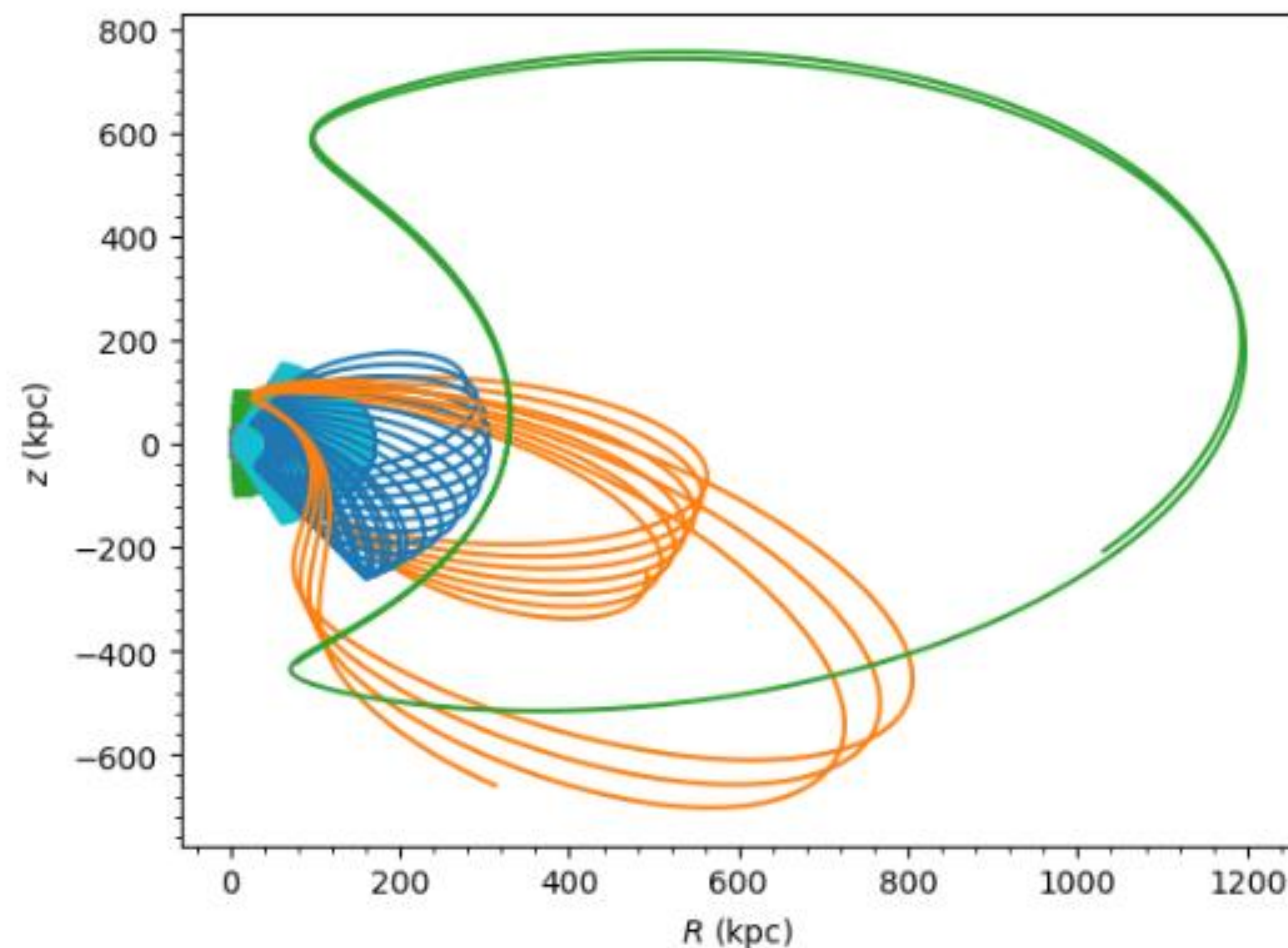


Milky Way v. LMC Friday Night Spectacular

Intro:
